

ChemDraw License for Select Users February 2019; DLO

To obtain the free ChemDraw License*, you need to be an employee or enrolled in:

- School of Chemical Sciences
 - Chemistry
 - Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering
- School of Life Sciences
 - Molecular and Cellular Biology
 - Biochemistry
 - Cell and Developmental Biology
 - Microbiology
 - Molecular and Integrative Physiology
 - Integrative Biology
 - Animal Biology
 - Entomology
 - Plant Biology

To obtain ChemDraw (the full, current, free version), go to:

You have to do this from a secured, campus Internet connection.

You should get two programs when you do this (check your programs list for both):

- ChemDraw (green icon that says “CD”); this does proton and carbon prediction
 - Mnova does proton, carbon, and HSQC prediction
- Do NOT accept the offer for Mnova NMR Lite; get the full Mnova version with directions provided elsewhere by the SCS NMR Lab.

If you have ChemDraw already, just activate the new license by responding to the pop-up window inquiries that open when you use the software. Use the “Activate over the Internet” choice.

The ChemDraw package is about 400 MB in size.
